God's Spirit breathes in and through us

All: The Holy Spirit who transforms us and all

life.

Presider: In this time and place

Together, one people of God.

All: In the name of God, Source of all being,

Eternal Word and Holy Spirit. Amen.

PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: EXODUS 15:1-11, 19-21

On the shores of the Reed Sea, Moses and Myriam sing a song of victory, one of the oldest passages in the bible.

Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord: 'I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea.

The Lord is my strength and my might, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him.

The Lord is a warrior; the Lord is his name.

'Pharaoh's chariots and his army he cast into the sea; his picked officers were sunk in the Red Sea.

The floods covered them;

they went down into the depths like a stone.

Your right hand, O Lord, glorious in power—your right hand, O Lord, shattered the enemy.

In the greatness of your majesty you overthrew your adversaries;

you sent out your fury, it consumed them like stubble.

At the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up, the floods stood up in a heap;

the deeps congealed in the heart of the sea.

The enemy said, "I will pursue, I will overtake,
I will divide the spoil, my desire shall have its fill of them.

I will draw my sword, my hand shall destroy them."

You blew with your wind, the sea covered them; they sank like lead in the mighty waters.

'Who is like you, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in splendour, doing wonders?

When the horses of Pharaoh with his chariots and his chariot drivers went into the sea, the Lord brought back the waters of the sea upon them; but the Israelites walked through the sea on dry ground.

Then the prophet Miriam, Aaron's sister, took a tambourine in her hand; and all the women went out after her with tambourines and with dancing. And Miriam sang to them: 'Sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea.'

Reader: Hear what the Spirit is saying.

All: Thanks be to God.

PSALM ALTERNATIVE: Memory (Cats)

SECOND READING: 1 PETER 1:22-25, 2:4-10

This letter to an early church incorporates several hymns that were part of the worship practice of Christian communities.

Now that you have purified your souls by your obedience to the truth so that you have genuine mutual love, love one another deeply from the heart. You have been born anew, not of perishable but of imperishable seed, through the living and enduring word of God. For

'All flesh is like grass

and all its glory like the flower of grass.

The grass withers,

and the flower falls,

but the word of the Lord endures for ever.'

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

'See, I am laying in Zion a stone,

a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.' To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe,

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner', and 'A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.'

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

Once you were not a people,
but now you are God's people;
once you had not received mercy,
but now you have received mercy.

Reader: Let us hear what the Spirit is saying

All: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL SONG: No One Is Alone (Into the Woods)

GOSPEL READING: LUKE 1:39-55

Mary sings as she greets her relative Elizabeth who is pregnant with John the Baptist. Her song echoes themes and content from Hannah's song of 1 Samuel. Each of these mothers of prophets sings about wanting their children to grow up in a world of justice for the least.

Presider: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, **All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.' And Mary said,

'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

He has shown strength with his arm;

he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;

he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy,

according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'

Presider: Holy Word, Holy Wisdom

All: Thanks be to God.

wounding and our broken-heartedness. You know how others have hurt us, and

how we have hurt others

You alone have the healing we need.

Yours is the love that changes

Everything.

Presider: Giver of life, may your loving kindness

be upon us; pardon and deliver, revive and strengthen, and keep us in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE PASSING OF THE PEACE

Presider: The peace of the Risen Christ be always

with you.

People: And also with you.

Remembering the gift of peace that Christ offers us we offer that gift to one another, standing at our seats, greet one another saying or gesturing: 'Peace be with you''.

PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

Presider: Loving God,

All: you have included us in your family.

Accept all we offer you this day and give us grace to live as faithful children. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our

Lord.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Presider: God be with you.

All: And also with you. Presider: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to God.

Presider: Let us give thanks to God our Creator.

All: We give our thanks and praise.

Presider: Eternal God, in the abundance of your love you

have caused all things to be; from dust and spirit you have woven our humanity; in all our

wanderings you never cease to call us to

fullness of life. You gave us Jesus, son of Mary,

the bread of life broken for the world.

Presider:

Jesus fed us and feasted with us, he healed us and suffered for us; his dying and rising have set us free from the poverty of sin and the famine of death.

Therefore, with all whom you have made, cherished and called, with all who hunger for you and will not rest until all your children are fed, with the broken saints and redeemed sinners of all the ages, we take up the song of your praise:

Sanctus (said)

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord
God of Power and Might
Heaven and Earth are full of your Glory
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the One
who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest.

Presider: We ask that your Holy Spirit

will fall upon us and upon these gifts that these fragile, earthly things may become holy for us and sustain us.

On the night that Jesus was betrayed, gathered with his faltering friends for a meal that tasted of freedom.

Calling them to his table,

he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said: 'This is my body, which is given for you.

Do this to remember me.'

In the same way after supper, he took the cup,

saying: 'This cup is the new covenant

Presider: Do this, whenever you drink it, to

remember me.'

As on that night, so here and now he offers himself in touch and taste beyond all words can hold. Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died

Christ is risen

Christ will come again.

Presider: Therefore, in our eating and drinking we are

filled with the life-giving presence of Christ;

we proclaim him as creation's host,

transforming poverty into plenty in the reckless

generosity of love.

All: Inspire us with the hope that one day

death and greed will be no more and people without number will come from east and west, north and south to share

Christ's meal of peace.

Presider: We ask this through Jesus the Christ, by

whom and with whom and in whom in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory be

yours, Mother of blessings,

for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

LORD'S PRAYER (Said)

FRACTION (Breaking the Bread):

Presider: Come to the banquet, for all is now ready.

All: Taste and see that the Lord is good.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE:

Presider: The gifts of God for the people of God

All: Thanks be to God.

COMMUNION:

All people are welcome to receive Communion of one or both kinds at the Altar or at the front of the church. If you wish to receive the wine, please drink from the cup but do not dip bread or wafer into the cup.

Gluten free wafers are available upon request. Please sanitize your hands before receiving.

While communion is being administered, we ask you to keep the silence. Candle lighting during this time is welcomed.

People: Thanks be to God.


