PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: 1 KINGS 8: 22-30, 41-43

Solomon built the temple in Jerusalem and put the ark of the covenant there. This passage includes part of the prayer Solomon prays at the dedication of the temple. He prays for God to hear the prayers of all the faithful.

Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands to heaven.

He said, "O Lord, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love for your servants who walk before you with all their heart, the covenant that you kept for your servant my father David as you declared to him; you promised with your mouth and have this day fulfilled with your hand. Therefore, O Lord, God of Israel, keep for your servant my father David that which you promised him, saying, 'There shall never fail you a successor before me to sit on the throne of Israel, if only your children look to their way, to walk before me as you have walked before me.' Therefore, O God of Israel, let your word be confirmed, which you promised to your servant my father David. "But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Even heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you, much less this house that I have built! Regard your servant's prayer and his plea, O Lord my God, heeding the cry and the prayer that your servant prays to you today; that your eyes may be open night and day toward this house, the place of which you said, 'My name shall be there,' that you may heed the prayer that your servant prays toward this place. Hear the plea of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray toward this place; O hear in heaven your dwelling place; heed and forgive. "Likewise when a foreigner, who is not of your people Israel, comes from a distant land because of your name —for they shall hear of your great name, your mighty hand, and your outstretched arm—when a foreigner comes and prays toward this house, then hear in heaven your dwelling place, and do according to all that the foreigner calls to you, so that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and fear you, as do your people Israel, and so that they may know that your name has been invoked on this house that I have built."

SECOND READING: EPHESIANS 6:10-20

Like a general giving a rousing speech to troops before battle, this letter closes by calling on Christians to be equipped for spiritual warfare wearing the full armor of God.

Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to guench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains.

Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

Reader: Let us hear what the Spirit is saying

All: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL HYMN: LORD, WE HEAR YOUR WORD

Lord, we hear your Word with gladness: you have spoken--we rejoice: words of love and life and freedom--help us make their truth our choice! Now in holy celebration for your Word we worship you; spoken, written, known in Jesus, ours today to prove anew.

May we hear with understanding, by your Spirit taught and led; may the springs of all our being by your Living Word be fed; may our hearts accept with meekness all the grace your light makes known; may obedience mark our footsteps till we make each word our own!

GOSPEL READING: JOHN 6:56-69

Jesus' "hard saying" offends people. Some disciples leave, Simon Peter, on the other hand, knows something about the scarcity of living, gracious words. He asks the most important question: "To whom shall we go?"

Presider: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: The Holy Gospel according to John, **All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Jesus said, "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever." He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum.

When many of his disciples heard it, they said, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, "Does this offend you? Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. ⁶⁵And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father."

Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, "Do you also wish to go away?" Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."

Presider: Holy Word, Holy Wisdom

All: Thanks be to God.

TABLE PREPARATION: I AM THE BREAD

I am the bread, the bread of life; who comes to me will never hunger. I am the bread, the bread of heaven; who feeds on me, will never die.

And as you eat, remember me – my body broken on the tree: my life was given to set you free. and I'm alive for evermore.

I am the vine, the living vine: apart from me you can do nothing. I am the vine, the real vine; abide in me and I in you. And as you drink, remember me – my blood was shed upon the tree; my life was given to set you free, and I'm alive for evermore.

So eat this bread, and drink this wine, and as you do, receive this life of mine, All that I am, I give to you, That you may live for evermore.

PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

Presider: O God,

All: we give you thanks

that you have set before us this feast, at

Christ's table.

By your Spirit strengthen us to serve all in need and to give ourselves away as

bread for the hungry,

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Presider: God be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to God.

Presider: Let us give thanks to God our Creator.

All: We give our thanks and praise.

Presider:

Eternal God, in the abundance of your love you have caused all things to be; from dust and spirit you have woven our humanity; in all our wanderings you never cease to call us to fullness of life. You gave us Jesus, son of Mary, the bread of life broken for the world. Jesus fed us and feasted with us, he healed us and suffered for us; his dying and rising have set us free from the poverty of sin and the famine of death.

Therefore, with all whom you have made, cherished and called, with all who hunger for you and will not rest until all your children are fed, with the broken saints and redeemed

sinners of all the ages, we take up the song of

your praise:

Sanctus (Holy)

Holy, Holy, my heart, my heart adores you! My heart is glad to say the words; you are holy Lord.

In God's name is coming the One whom we call blessed. Hosanna in the highest. Praise and thanks to God.

Presider: We ask that your Holy Spirit

will fall upon us and upon these gifts that these fragile, earthly things

may become holy for us and sustain us.

Presider: On the night that Jesus was betrayed,

gathered with his faltering friends for a meal

that tasted of freedom. Calling them to his table,

he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said:

'This is my body, which is given for you.

Do this to remember me.'

In the same way after supper, he took the cup, saying: 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, to

remember me.'

As on that night, so here and now he offers himself in touch and taste beyond all words can hold. Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died

Christ is risen

Christ will come again.

Presider: Therefore, in our eating and drinking we are

filled with the life-giving presence of Christ;

we proclaim him as creation's host,

transforming poverty into plenty in the reckless

generosity of love.

All: Inspire us with the hope that one day

death and greed will be no more and people without number will come from east and west, north and south to share

Christ's meal of peace.

Presider: We ask this through Jesus the Christ, by

whom and with whom and in whom in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory be

yours, Mother of blessings,

for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

LORD'S PRAYER (Sung):

All: Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come, your will be done

on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial

and deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power

and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

All people are welcome to receive Communion of one or both kinds at the Altar or at the front of the church. If you wish to receive the wine, please drink from the cup but do not dip bread or wafer into the cup.

Gluten free wafers are available upon request. Please sanitize your hands before receiving.

While communion is being administered, we ask you to keep the silence. Candle lighting during this time is welcomed.
