GATHERING HYMN: SING OF GOD MADE MANIFEST (162)

Sing of God made manifest in a child robust and blest, to whose home in Bethlehem where a star had guided them, magi came and gifts unbound, signs mysterious and profound: myrrh and frankincense and gold grave and God and king foretold.

Sing of God made manifest when at Jordan John confessed, "I should be baptized by you, but your bidding I will do."
Then from heaven a double sign—dove-like Spirit, voice divine—hailed the true Anointed One: "This is my beloved Son."

Sing of God made manifest when Christ came as wedding guest and at Cana gave a sign, turning water into wine; further still was love revealed as he taught, forgave, and healed, bringing light and life to all who would listen to God's call.

PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 43:1-7

Near the end of the exile in Babylon, God promises to bring the people of Ancient Israel home. They need no longer be afraid, because the one who formed, created, and called them by name now redeems and declares them precious. But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you.

Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, "Give them up," And to the south, "Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth—everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

PSALM 29

Leader: Ascribe to the Lord, you gods,

SECOND READING: ACTS 8:14-17

Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the news of Christ through the preaching of Philip.

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them.

The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Reader: Let us hear what the Spirit is saying.

All: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL HYMN: DOWN GALILEE'S SLOW ROADWAYS (CP 45)

Down Galilee's slow roadways a stranger traveled on from Nazareth to Jordan to be baptized by John. He went down to the waters like soldier, scribe, and slave, but there within the river the sign was birth and grave.

Arising from the river he saw the heavens torn; it seemed the sky so open revealed the Spirit's form. The holy dove descended amid a glorious voice: "You are my own beloved, my child, my heart, my choice."

GOSPEL READING: LUKE 3:15-17, 21-22

The reading opens with questions about the identity of the long-expected Messiah. John the Baptist insists that he is not the Messiah; instead he points ahead to One who is coming. Jesus is named as God's beloved Son, the Christ.

Presider: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Presider: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Presider: The Gospel of Christ.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL HYMN cont... (CP 45)

We too have found a roadway; it led us to this place. We all have had to travel in search of hope and grace. But now beside this water again a voice is heard. "You are my own, my chosen, beloved of your Lord."

RENEWAL OF BAPTISM VOWS

In the traditional language of the Church from the 4th and 5th Centuries we affirm the faith.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Creator of all?

People: I believe in God, creator of heaven

and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ,

his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived

by the power of the Holy Spirit and

born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in God the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching

and fellowship, in the breaking of bread,

and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil and,

whenever you fall into sin, repent and

return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example

the good news of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons,

loving your neighbour as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace

among all people, and respect the dignity of

every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of

God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew

the life of the Earth?

People: I will, with God's help.

The water is poured into the font.

Presider: At the beginning of time, you blessed Mother

earth with water. And during each pregnancy,

you nurture new life in the waters of the

womb. In the fullness of time,

Jesus was baptized in the River Jordan,

repenting for the sin of the world

and restoring to water

its healing work in all creation.

Presider: Breathe your Spirit, O God, upon this water

that everything that is washed and anointed

may share with Christ in his death

and resurrection.

Presider: May there be spiritual renewal in this place,

All: healing us from victimhood to freedom,

from fear to trust, from division to unity.

Presider: May this church be a sanctuary

for all who seek.

All: May we become a sign and

foretaste of your Kingdom,

a diverse people,

open to the light. Amen.

COMMUNION

PREPARING THE TABLE: WORD OF GOD, COME DOWN TO EARTH (CP 446)

Word of God, come down on earth, living rain from heaven descending; touch our hearts and bring to birth faith and hope and love unending. Word almighty we revere you; Word made flesh, we long to hear you.

Word eternal, throned on high, Word that brought to life creation, Word that came from heaven to die, crucified for our salvation, saving Word, the world restoring, speak to us, your love outpouring.

Word that caused blind eyes to see, speak and heal our mortal blindness; deaf we are: our healer be; loose our tongues to tell your kindness. Be our Word in pity spoken; heal the world, by our sin broken.

Word that speaks your Father's love, one with him beyond all telling, Word that sends us from above God the Spirit, with us dwelling, Word of truth, to all truth lead us, Word of life, with one Bread feed us.

Presider: God of steadfast love,

All: may our offering this day,

by the power of your Holy Spirit,

renew us for your service.

We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ

the Lord. Amen

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER (Supplemental Prayer 3)

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: It is indeed right to thank you and praise you,

holy and gracious God, creator of all things, ruler of heaven and earth, sustainer of life, for you are the source of all goodness, rich in mercy and abounding in love; you are faithful to your people in every generation, and your word endures for ever.

Therefore, with angels and archangels, with the fellowship of saints and the company of heaven, we glorify your holy name, evermore praising you and singing,

SANCTUS (719)

Holy, holy holy, Lord. God of power and might, heaven and earth are full, of your glory. Hosanna! in the highest!

Blessed, is the one who comes, in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest! Hosanna in the highest!

Presider: We praise you, merciful

Mother and Father,

not as we ought, but as we are able,

because in your tender love

you gave the world your only Son,

in order that the world might be saved through him. He made you known by taking the form of

a servant, healing the sick, liberating the oppressed, reaching out to the lost.

Betrayed, reviled, and nailed to the cross,

he confronted the power of sin

and disarmed it for ever. In his offering of himself,

he became the perfect and sufficient sacrifice

for the sins of the whole world.

Redeemed by Christ,

we have been adopted as your children;

by your pardon

you have made us worthy to praise you.

Presider:

On the night he was betrayed,
Jesus, at supper with his friends,
took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread,
gave it to them, and said, "Take and eat:
this is my body which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

In obedience to him and with grateful hearts we approach your holy table, remembering our Saviour's sacrifice, and rejoicing in his victory.

Confident in his sovereign purpose, we declare our faith.

All:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

All:

Send your Holy Spirit on us that as we receive this bread and this cup we may partake of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Presider: May we be renewed in his risen life,

filled with love, and strengthened in our will to

serve others; and make of our lives, we

pray, a pure and holy sacrifice, acceptable to you, knitting us together as one in your Son

Jesus Christ, to whom,

with you and the Holy Spirit,

be all honour and glory, now and forever.

All: Amen.

LORD'S PRAYER (Sung):

All: Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come, your will be done

on earth as in heaven.

Forgive us our sins
